CSUMB-KQED Scholarship in Science Media Communication

Funded by the Fuhs Family Foundation

Dr. Fuhs believes in the importance of clearly communicating science concepts to the general public. The Fuhs Family foundation has provided funding to CSUMB for a **one year \$10,000 scholarship** and a **paid summer internship** in science communication at KQED Public Media in San Francisco*.

Applications are being accepted now beginning with the 2019 summer internship and scholarship support for the academic year beginning Fall 2019.

Selection Criteria:

1. Junior, Senior or Graduate student status by Summer 2019, continuing in Fall 2019.
2. Declared Science Major in the College of Science.
3. Demonstrated interest in science communication and journalism.
4. In good academic standing with a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

To apply, students meeting the criteria will be required to provide:

1. A 250-word essay identifying their career interests in connection with science communication.
2. The name of a science faculty, who knows the student's work, is informed of the student's interest in the scholarship and internship and will recommend them for this award.

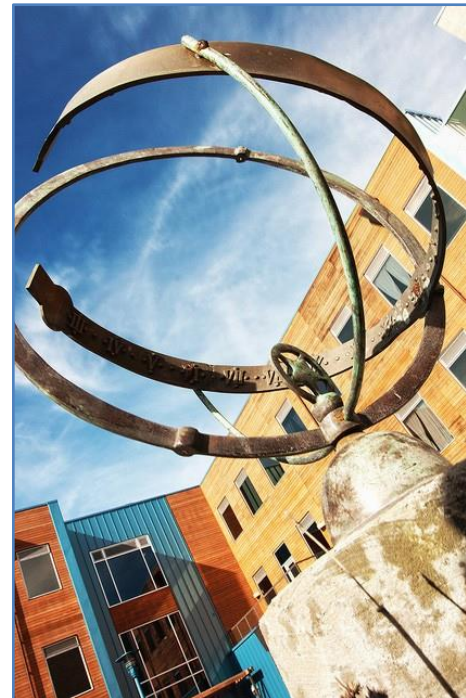
Deadline for submission is February 15th, 2019.
