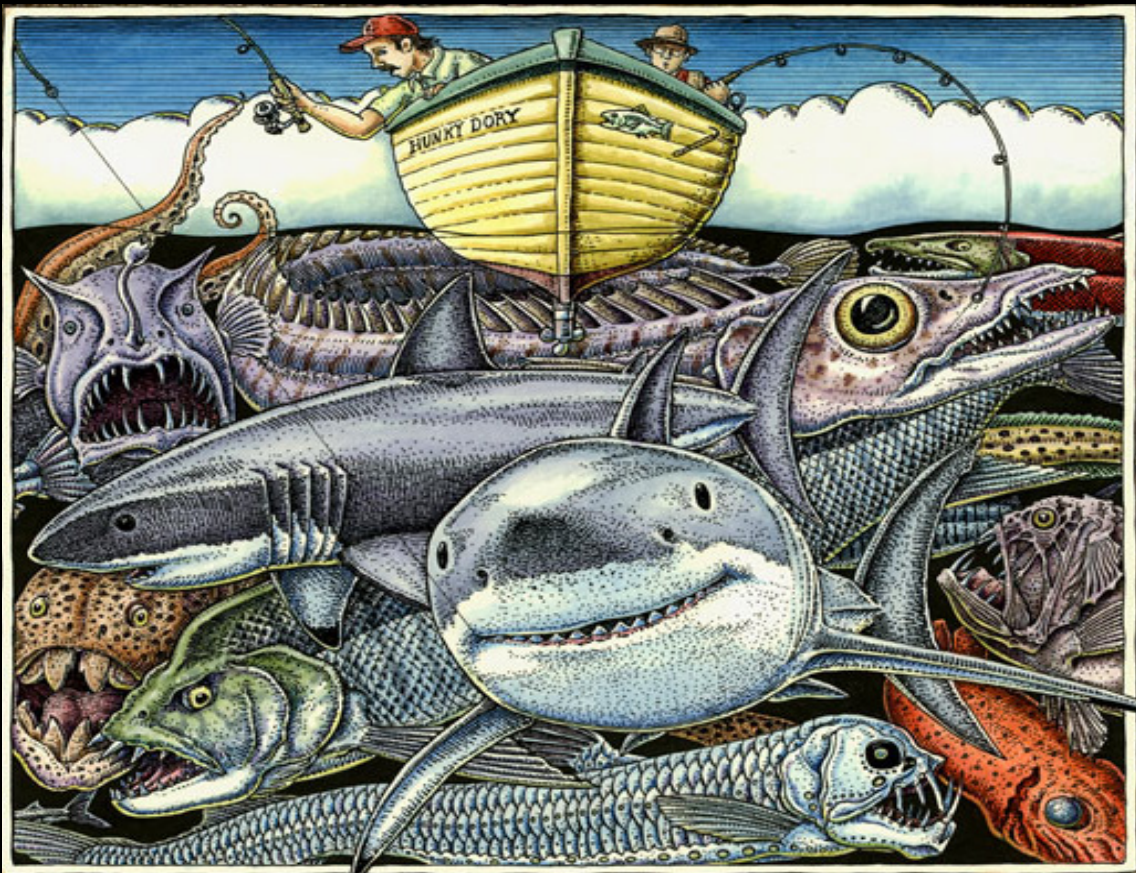

Chris Lowe, PhD - Professor, California State University Long Beach. *Dr. Lowe works with acoustic and satellite telemetry techniques to study the movement, behavior and physiology of sharks, rays and gamefishes.*



Sal Jorgensen, PhD - Research Scientist, Monterey Bay Aquarium. *Dr. Jorgensen oversees basic research on migratory patterns, feeding ecology and habitat use of adult great white sharks at the Farallon Islands, Point Reyes and Año Nuevo Island.*



Barb Block, PhD - Professor, Stanford's Hopkins Marine Station. *Dr. Block's research focuses on how large pelagic fishes utilize the open ocean environment - centering upon understanding the evolution of heat management strategies in tunas, billfishes, and sharks.*
